### PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, Mississippi has been celebrating Arbor Day since 1926 as a special day to recognize the statewide contributions of trees and forests. The State of Mississippi benefits from forestry, which contributes billions of dollars to the state's economy and millions toward education through School Trust Land timber sale revenue, and employs almost 70,000 people; and

**WHEREAS**, Mississippi's trees and forests provide jobs, tax revenue, School Trust Land revenue, wood products, energy, fuel, clean air, water, reduced energy consumption, outdoor recreation opportunities, and abundant wildlife habitats, while slowing the loss of topsoil due to erosion; and

**WHEREAS**, forest resources are sustainably utilized to enhance economic development, provide environmental benefits and educational opportunities, reduce the impact of pollution, and enhance the quality of life for the residents of Mississippi; and

**WHEREAS**, on Arbor Day and during Tree Planting Week, community partners, families, and friends join together to celebrate the benefits of trees and urban forests, and to recognize the unique beauty and diversity of our native trees which provide a powerful and lasting impression on visitors and lifelong memories for residents; and

**WHEREAS**, trees will be planted statewide, creating a lasting legacy for future generations.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Tate Reeves, Governor of the State of Mississippi, do hereby proclaim February 13, 2026, as

### **ARBOR DAY**

in the State of Mississippi, and I do further proclaim Friday, February 13 – Thursday, February 19, 2026, as

### **TREE PLANTING WEEK**

in the State of Mississippi and urge all residents to plant a tree.
